Not illustrated. 1898 Excerpt: ... weight consisted of the heavier rail-section in lengths of 12 feet, the lighter in 12-foot lengths and also in 18-foot lengths. The first and last lengths, weighing 140 lbs. and 150 lbs. respectively, were reckoned as two to a mule-load, or three of the second lengths. The practicability and cheapest method of transport were discussed with experts before the rails were ordered; and one object in view in so varying the weights was to utilize the varying powers of the animals comprised in ordinary mule-trains. Half a load or carga (of 300 lbs.) is the usual limit of weight, but certain parts of the rolling-stock weighed necessarily more than a full load. These, up to a maximum of 450 lbs. for a small number of pieces only, were transported by relays of the strongest mules, each animal carrying the load for a short distance at a time. Some parts of the road approaching the summit west of Chinipas were so steep, and the zigzags so short, that the rails were more conveniently carried up and down on mens shoulders; and a few bulky and light packages were so carried over the whole length from the end of the practicable wagon-road, a distance of 45 miles. The cost of transport from the coast to Chinipas, including landing-expenses, storage, agency and all charges between the ship and the stationyard, was \$75 (Mexican) per ton (2,000 lbs.) for the rails and rolling-stock, \$60 for the sleepers, and \$56 for the remainder of the material and stores; being thus between twice and three times the freight of the same from Liverpool to New Orleans or Galveston, thence by rail to Guaymas on the Gulf of California, and by small coasting steamers or sailing craft to Agiabampo, distant 150 miles from Chinipas.
