For the rest of his life he barely acknowledged that autumn in the Alps. But an obscure passage in Levi's *The Periodic Table* hints that his deportation to Auschwitz was linked directly to an incident from that time: an ugly secret that had made him give up the struggle, extinguishing all will to resist, indeed to live. What did Levi mean by those dramatic lines? Using extensive archival research, Sergio Luzzatto's groundbreaking *Primo Levi's Resistance* reconstructs the events of 1943 in vivid detail. Just days before Levi was captured, Luzzatto shows, his group summarily executed two teenagers who had sought to join the partisans, deciding the boys were reckless and couldn't be trusted. The brutal episode has been shrouded in silence, but its repercussions would shape Levi's life. Combining investigative flair with profound empathy, *Primo Levi's Resistance* offers startling insight into the origins of the moral complexity that runs through the work of Primo Levi himself.
